### **European hockey is important for the NHL**

Since 1973, more than **900** Europeans have played in the NHL Since 1980, there have been Europeans on every Stanley Cup winning team except 1993. Total: **91** Europeans have won **140** Cup titles. Percentage of Europeans in the NHL 2009-10: **23.8** percent

**BUT:** The percentage of Top Category Players was even higher:

Starting goalies: 53%

Top 4-Defensemen: 33.3%

Top 6-Forwards: 38.3%




#### A worrying trend

In the last 10-15 years, many Europeans who are not even established in Europe and therefore not NHL-ready sign with NHL-clubs

Mass migration of Europeans to CHL. Especially Czechs and Slovaks

Between 1997 and 2010 ca. **840** players have left Europe to play in the CHL. More than **500** (**60%**) of them are Czechs and Slovaks

### A worrying trend

- Agents misinform young players and their families
- They withhold information about numbers reflecting the success rate of Europeans who take the CHL route




"CHL exposure is the best way to get drafted"

CHL Import Drafts 1997 - 2005 527 European Drafts

At the same time 1997-2005: 803 Europeans get NHL-drafted directly from their European clubs.

More than 50% do not get NHL-drafted




■ Euro CHL Players who were never NHL-drafted■ Euro CHL Players who were NHL-drafted

#### A worrying trend

- Success rate (400 NHL games) among CHL Europeans is 4.2%.
- Our research shows 22 successful CHL Europeans out of 527.
- Agents do not pass on this kind of information to young players.
- Are agents aware of these numbers?



#### Impact on Czech and Slovak Hockey


Depleted junior leagues in Europe have a very serious effect on the entire development system.

#### **ALSO:**


- ❖ The less competitive environment in the junior leagues in CZE and SVK is directly reflected in the decline of CZE/SVK players in the NHL-draft
  - and consequently in the numbers of NHL players from those countries.



#### Czech Players Drafted to the NHL 2000-2010




Slovak Players Drafted to the NHL 2000-2010




NHL Draft 2010: Only 1 (!) homegrown CZE/SVK

NHL Draft 2000: 31 homegrown CZEs/SVKs






#### Czech Players in the NHL 2000-2009

#### Impact on the NHL and International hockey

Not only the CZE and SVK hockey programs are losers. Hockey itself – and the NHL – are losers.

The system is bare scraped – there are no more players like Jagr, Hossa, Gaborik, Hasek, Satan, Kaberle, Hejduk or Bondra.



#### **Effects of CHL mass migration**


On players: Lesser success rate as pros. Less consistent careers. Longer development curve. Shorter NHL careers. Command less salary. Clearly below percentage of Euros who are NHL Top Category Performers.

On Czech and Slovak U20 national teams: Continuous performance decline since 1999.

Players who break their line of development at home very often lose their national characteristics as they become hybrids – players with very few qualities that set them apart.

#### You can't rush development

- Players who develop in their own environment until 21-23 (domestic league, national team experience) become better NHL players.
- IIHF Study 2006 (player scale 1-5; 621 players researched)
- "Patient Group" (stay at home until NHL-ready) Avg. Grade: 3.47
- \* "CHL/AHL Group" (At least 1 CHL season/100 AHL games) Avg. Grade: 1.44



#### Developing skill comes out of practice...

Players who develop patiently, acquiring 10'000 hours of practice at home have better NHL careers.

#### Example:

<u>Magnus Pääjärvi-Svensson</u> aquired 10.440 hours between age 6 and 19.
After 3 pro seasons in Sweden, two U18 Worlds, three U20 Worlds, one IIHF Worlds (on All Star Team) he is probably NHL ready.



#### Developing skill comes out of patience...

Because our team has been good over the years, we didn't have to rush anybody. The NHL is the toughest league in the world, both physically and mentally. And if you are not a man, if you are still a young player and still developing (and you are brought up too soon) this league will over time take your confidence away.






### **The Potential Gap**

The goal can not be to "dip your toe" in the NHL at any cost

The goal must be to become a player who fulfills ones potential = minimum 400 games in the NHL

Many of today's NHL players have not reached their potential.





#### **European Demoralization**

Why should millions be spent on development programs in Europe when the players leave for North America often before the age of 18 – and we are not even compensated?



### The Development Pool is Shrinking

- ❖ 85-90 percent of all Europeans in the NHL come from five nations:
  - SWE, CZE, RUS, FIN, SVK
  - Czech Republic and Slovakia: In trouble
  - Finland and Russia: Struggling
  - Sweden: Remain healthy
- A serious situation. Also to the NHL, if the League wants to maintain its quality and keep recruiting players who bring special qualities to the ice

#### The Losers

If international hockey becomes less competitive and more predictable...

#### **Hockey Canada and IIHF**

The World Juniors (U20) lose in popularity due to a less competitive field. The domination of CAN/USA in both U20 and U18 clearly indicates the lack of development in Europe right now

#### **NHL and NHLPA**

The World Cup of Hockey becomes less competitive

#### **Everybody (mostly IIHF member federations)**

The Olympics and the World Championship become less competitive



### **All Competitions Are Impacted**















The goal must be to keep the development streams strong on both sides of the Atlantic by keeping the young players in their own federations and leagues until they are ready for NHL play.
