Title of lesson <p style="text-align: center;">Female Ice Hockey in Canada and Around the World</p>	
Purpose <p>This lesson is designed to have students explore the status of womens' ice hockey in Canada and around the world. This lesson is targeted for use in a Social Studies classroom g.9-12</p>	
Learning outcome(s) <p>Students will have researched women's sport and be able to form reasonable responses to questions on the development of women's ice hockey in Canada, and around the world.</p>

Pre-test <p>1. Have a brief class discussion on the history of women's sport in Canada. When did women start to participate in organized sport? What are some significant milestones in the development of women's sport?</p> <p>3. Create a timeline outlining female ice hockey highlights and firsts in Canada and Around the World (see attached timeline re-producible template)</p>	
Input from you <p>The construction of a timeline for womens' ice hockey could be broadened to include female sports in general.</p>	Guided practice <p>Use the websites listed above to research female ice hockey. Construct a timeline of female hockey highlights in Canada and Around the World.</p>
Closure <p>Students should complete timelines following criteria of 10 events and 3 illustrations.</p>	
Check for understanding <p>Ask students to share their work. Was there any similarity in what they thought were significant milestones? Why?</p>
