THEY MAY NOT HAVE WON THEIR LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP, but the Brockville Braves will have a shot at a national title after winning the Fred Page Cup on home ice to book a trip to Dauphin. The Central Junior Hockey League's regular-season champions, the Braves won a neck-and-neck battle with the Pembroke Lumber Kings for top spot, finishing just a single point ahead of the Lumber Kings and 19 points ahead of any other CJHL team, thanks in large part to a CJHL-record 26-game winning streak from October 30 to January 15. Brockville's league-leading offence was a two-Shayned attack, as Shayne Stockton (98 points) and Shayne Thompson (87 points) both earned top-10 spots in the CJHL scoring race, while Scott Arnold and Mark Williamson also cracked the top 25. Between the pipes Clarke Saunders was a wall, winning 31 games and finishing second with a 2.31 goals-against average, just 0.02 behind leader Scott Zacharias of Pembroke. The Braves cruised through the first two rounds of the playoffs, sweeping past Kemptville and Ottawa in four games each, playing in just two one-goal games, setting up the expected final against Pembroke, who were looking to become the first team in the history of the CJHL to win four consecutive league championships. After splitting the first two games - with each winning a one-goal contest on the other team's home ice - the Lumber Kings took control of the series, outscoring the Braves 14-5 over the last three games to deny Brockville its first Bogart-Nielsen Cup since 1998. The Braves had their chance for revenge, as they hosted the East Region championship at Brockville Memorial Arena, but they would have to do so without the services of Saunders, who injured his knee at a pre-tournament practice, forcing the Braves to turn to Justin Gilbert, who saw action in just two games during the playoff run. After a convincing 6-0 win over the Woodstock Slammers to open the tournament, Brockville once again faced off against Pembroke, with a likely bye to the championship game on the line. Scott Dawson was the hero, scoring with less than 10 minutes to go in the third period, clinching a 2-1 victory for the Braves which, coupled with their 5-2 win over the Cobras de Terrebonne in the round-robin finale, sent them directly to the final. Their opponents? Who else, the Pembroke Lumber Kings. The game would not be as close as their round-robin meeting as Brockville opened up a 4-0 advantage before the seven-minute mark of the second period en route to a 5-1 win and its first berth at the National Junior A Championship since the 1998 Royal Bank Cup in Nanaimo, B.C.

DAUPHIN KINGS

HOST/HÔTE

AFTER A STRING OF EARLY PLAYOFF EXITS by past RBC Cup host teams – Weyburn, Streetsville, Prince George and Cornwall in Round 1, Victoria in Round 2 – the Dauphin Kings did something no National Junior A Championship host had done since the Grande Prairie Storm in 2004 – win their league championship. The Kings were far and away the class of the Manitoba Junior Hockey League during the regular season, winning 50 of 62 games and finishing 21 points clear of the Portage Terriers, the MJHL's No. 2 team. The league-leading offence was led by the line of Shane Luke, Ryan Dreger and Bryce Lamb, who finished first, second and fourth, respectively, in the league scoring race, led by Luke's 101 points and Dreger's 53 goals. The defence was just as impressive, allowing a league-low 169 goals, backstopped by netminder Joe Caligiuri, who posted the MJHL's second-best goals against average, and 20-year-old captain Steven Shamanski, who earned both the top defenceman and player of the year awards in the Manitoba league. After cruising past Neepawa in the quarter-finals, allowing just six goals in a four-game sweep, the Kings put on an offensive show against Swan Valley in the semis, racking up 22 goals in the first three games, including a 12-2 romp in Game 3 – led by two-point performances from 12 different players – before closing the Stampeders out in five games. The MJHL final was a showdown between the two regular season conference champions, with the Winnipeg Saints providing the opposition for the Kings. The Saints entered the series even hotter than Dauphin, having swept past Winnipeg South and Winkler to reach the championship series. Despite being a match-up of two of the league's highest scoring teams, the first and third games were defensive struggles, with a 6-1 Dauphin win in Game 2 sandwiched between a pair of 1-0 overtime classics, both won by the Kings. With a chance to close out their first league title in 17 years on home ice Dauphin did not disappoint, erasing a 4-0 second-period deficit and earning a 5-4 victory to sweep the Saints and advance to the ANAVET Cup against the SJHL champions from La Ronge. After dropping Game 1, the Kings tied Game 2 with three seconds to go before earning a double-overtime victory to send the series back to Dauphin tied 1-1. Despite a bout of food poisoning on the trip back to Manitoba, the Kings rattled off three wins in a row on home ice to earn their second-ever ANAVET title, and roll into the national championship with a regional crown under their belts.

LA RONGE ICE WOLVES

FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THEIR 12-YEAR EXISTENCE, the La Ronge Ice Wolves will play for the National Junior A Championship after a shocking run to the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League title. The Ice Wolves entered the season coming off of a last-place finish in 2008-09, when they won just 11 games, and finished the 2009-10 regular season fourth in the Bauer Conference, seventh of 12 SJHL teams. Doug Lindensmith (62 points) led an offensively-charged Ice Wolves team that finished third in the SJHL in goal scoring, but had only a +15 goal differential thanks to a goals-against that ranked in the bottom third of the league. La Ronge opened the playoffs by ending the reign of the Humboldt Broncos, sweeping the 2008 national champions and 2009 national runners-up in a best-of-five series, earning them a date with the Flin Flon Bombers, the Bauer Conference's regular season champions. A pair of one-goal wins in Flin Flon, followed by an overtime triumph on home ice, gave the Ice Wolves a seemingly insurmountable 3-0 series lead, and after back-to-back extra-time wins put the Bombers within striking distance, the Ice Wolves wrapped up a surprising upset with a 3-2 victory in Game 6. Next up were the Battlefords North Stars, and the Ice Wolves again used overtime to their advantage, winning in the extra period in Game 1 and Game 4 to go up 3-1 in the series, which they eventually finished in six games. The SJHL final was one that no one would have predicted when the playoffs began, as it matched up the Ice Wolves and the Yorkton Terriers, who finished with the fewest points of any postseason-bound team, but pulled off a trio of upsets to reach the final. With the RBC Cup host Dauphin Kings already crowned MJHL champions, the winner of the final would have an automatic berth to the National Junior A Championship as the West Region representative, giving the championship series some added drama. Overtime was again the friend of the Ice Wolves, as they took their first lead of the series with an OT win in Game 3 before clinching the franchise's first SJHL title on Liam Brennan's overtime winner in Game 6, advancing to the ANAVET Cup against the Kings. Starting the series on home ice, the Ice Wolves took Game 1 and came within three seconds of a 2-0 series lead before the Kings earned a double-overtime win to even it at 1-1. Headed back to Dauphin, the Ice Wolves fell victim to a red-hot home team, dropping three in a row to lose the series in five games. But despite not claiming regional glory, a shot at a national championship still exists.

OAKVILLE BLADES

AFTER A ONE-YEAR HIATUS, the Oakville Blades are back at the National Junior A Championship, hoping for a better result than their debut appearance in 2008, when they missed the semifinals and finished fifth in Cornwall, Ont. After losing their league championship to the Kingston Voyageurs in 2009 – falling in six games in the final – the Blades spent the 2009-10 season again chasing the Voyageurs, finishing four points back of Kingston atop the Ontario Junior A Hockey League standings, despite losing just nine times in regulation in 56 games. Oakville's league-leading offence was sparked by the foursome of Mark McGowan, Ryan Murphy, Steven Guzzo and Josh Ranalli, all of whom finished among the OJAHL's top 20 in scoring, led by McGowan's 74 points – good for a tie for seventh. On the defensive end, Daniel Savelli finished an impressive 21-2 between the pipes with a 2.26 goals-against average (second in the OJAHL), while Mike Morissette won 25 games and earned a top-five finish with a 2.48 GAA. After quickly dispatching Aurora in the opening round of the playoffs, outscoring the Tigers 24-10 in five games, the Blades needed just five games to knock off Georgetown in the semifinals, setting up another meeting with the Voyageurs with OJAHL bragging rights on the line. The series was a classic, featuring seven one-goal games and four overtime contests, including the deciding Game 7. The Blades and Voyageurs split the first four games, with each winning once on home ice and once on the road – Oakville won Game 2 in double overtime and Game 3 in the first OT, Kingston needed extra time in Game 4. After the Blades seemingly took control with a Game 5 win on the road, the Voyageurs earned an away victory of their own, sending the series back to Kingston for Game 7, where Kyle Badham was the hero for Oakville, scoring 12:22 into overtime to give the Blades the OJAHL title. With their biggest rivals vanquished, the Blades met the CCHL champions, the Newmarket Hurricanes, for OHA supremacy and a spot in the Dudley Hewitt Cup. Once again overtime was key for Oakville – Ranalli's OT winner in Game 5 paved the way for a six-game series win over the Hurricanes, sending the Blades to Sault Ste. Marie for the Central Region championship. After a 6-0 rout of the Abitibi Eskimos in its opener, Oakville topped the host Soo Thunderbirds 3-1 and snuck by the Fort William North Stars 2-1 in overtime, claiming first in the round robin and earning a bye to the championship game. Matched up again against the North Stars, Murphy's third-period goal stood up as the winner as the Blades stamped their ticket to Dauphin with a 2-1 victory.

AFTER LAST YEAR'S DRIVE FOR FIVE ended with the franchise's record-breaking fifth National Junior A Championship, the Vernon Vipers are back, looking for an unprecedented sixth national crown. With 13 returning players, the Vipers ran roughshod over the B.C. Hockey League during the regular season, winning 51 of 60 games and earning at least a point in 54. Their 105 points left them five clear of Penticton atop the Interior Conference, and 25 ahead of third-place Westside. Connor Jones, named Top Forward at the 2009 RBC Cup, finished eighth in the BCHL scoring race with 81 points to lead the Vipers, while Mike Collins also earned a top-10 finish with 76. Graeme Gordon, who served as back-up to Andrew Hammond during last year's run to the national title, finished with the league's third-best goals against average, posting a 2.06 GAA, while Blake Voth, who saw action in 24 regular season games, topped the league at 1.79 while going 21-2-0. After their regular season conference title earned them a first-round bye, the Vipers faced off against Quesnel in the quarter-finals, with the Millionaires stealing Game 2 in Vernon and winning Game 4 at home to send the series back to the Okanagan tied 2-2. But the Vipers' defence clamped down from there, not allowing the Millionaires another goal in the series, winning 4-0 and 5-0 to set up a showdown with Penticton in a battle of the BCHL's best regular season teams. After winning both games in Vernon and splitting the games at the South Okanagan Events Centre in Penticton the Vipers had the Vees on the ropes, and a triple-overtime win by Penticton in Game 5 only delayed the inevitable as Vernon wrapped up the series in six. The BCHL final was a rematch of 2009, as Vernon and the Powell River Kings faced off in a classic series that saw the Vipers erase a 1-0 deficit in Game 7 and score the eventual series-winner with five minutes to go in the third period, clinching the city's 10th league championship since 1971. The Doyle Cup matched up two of Canada's top teams, as the Vipers and Spruce Grove Saints combined for a 103-17 record, and the series didn't disappoint. The Vipers left Alberta with a 2-1 series lead after a double-overtime win in Game 3 and were on the verge of victory after a Game 4 triumph, but back-to-back wins by Spruce Grove forced a Game 7. Vernon took control with three goals in a 2:08 span late in the first period en route to a 7-3 win and an opportunity to defend their title in Dauphin.
